Search Committee Report

Since our last report to you the search committee has made significant progress. We have narrowed our search down to seven clergy candidates who we feel best meet the requirements to serve successfully as rector of Holy Cross. I think I can speak for all of our committee members in saying that we feel good about the priests under consideration.

Our next step is to get to know each of these candidates much better. We have read material that they have sent to us, including sermons that they have prepared. We have listened to taped sermons that they provided for us, and we have had telephone interviews with several of them.

We expect to complete all telephone interviews by the middle of February. After that we will decide which candidates best meet our requirements and narrow the list a bit. Our next step will be to arrange on-site visits with the candidates and their families. We'll visit their churches, listen to them preach, pray, and generally observe how they conduct the worship service in their home church. We hope that these visits can be concluded by the end of March or middle of April.

After the on-site visits are finished your search committee will prayerfully discuss and decide on two or three candidates to invite to Pensacola for further interviews here. We will also ask them to lead us in a wor-

ship service and preach a sermon. During those visits we will want to make sure that they get to know our church, this community and the bishop. It's just as important that they get to know us as it is for us to get to know them. If all goes well this should occur during April and May.

After all of the visits are over it is my hope that the search committee will worship together, pray together and then make a decision on which candidate to recommend to the vestry. The vestry will probably invite the candidate back to Pensacola for a final interview. They will either accept or reject the candidate. The candidate will either accept or reject the offer if it's given.

My prayer is for God to lead all of us, clergy candidates, search committee and vestry, through the rest of the process and speak loudly to our hearts and minds so that when we're ready to make the decision, the choice for each will be clear and readily accepted. Assuming one of the seven candidates will be our choice, my best guess is that it will be late spring or early summer before we have a rector.

Please keep your search committee and these seven candidates in your prayers.

Dear Holy Cross family,

January 18th and 19th, the Vestry met at St. Cyprians in Pensacola for our annual retreat. Fr. There is a light at the end of the tunnel for the search for our New Rector. The search committee has had many meetings in January and has a full agenda in February. Britt Landrum will tell you but I wanted to tell you too: keep the faith, be patient, remain involved in the life of the church and remain expectant of what is to come. It promises to be an exciting time for Holy Cross.

For this year's Easter Fun Day, we are extending our invitation to the Children's Learning Center families. I was impressed from last years' examples of serving

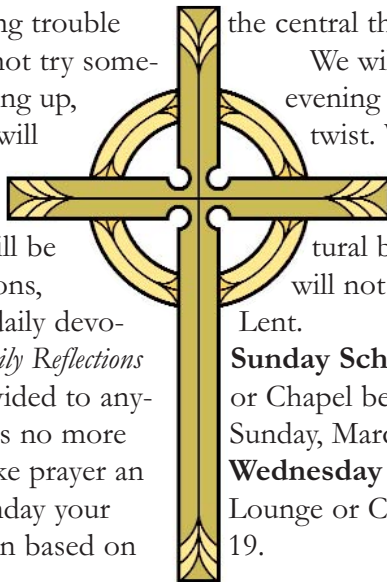

My eldest son, Aaron, was recently confirmed at St. Anna's Episcopal Church. This event may seem routine for many as we all have been through confirmation, but for me it was a moment of profound joy and happiness. You see, I also do double duty. I strive to ensure my children have a full circle of spirituality which includes our traditional Lakota religion and culture. This has been difficult because we have lived in cities almost his entire childhood. There are only a couple times a year when he has been able to attend traditional religious and cultural ceremonies because we live so far from home (Pine Ridge, South Dakota). He had his naming ceremony at a Sundance when he was five (his name is Wanbli Ksapi - Eagle Wisdom). I've also ensured that he has a strong connection to our family on the reservation by allowing him to spend 2-3 weeks there in summer since he was eight. He has attended several sundances and pow-wows since he was little. Last year, he participated his first sweatlodge ceremony. He is now twelve years old.

As a parent, you always wonder if your child actually listens during the lectures or pays attention during the ceremony or service. Over the years, I've taught traditional values of Respect, Honesty, Fortitude, Generosity, Courage, Responsibility and Wisdom. Do

they understand? I, myself, did not find my full circle of spirituality until my late 20s. It was a struggle I endured, feeling I had to choose Traditional Lakota Religion or Episcopalianism. When I finally learned I did not have to choose, I found my peace.

Aaron began confirmation classes in December and I told him it was his decision. You see, he was also being strongly courted to follow another denomination of the church by a close family member. At times, he seemed very confused and upset. I did not say anything negative because he's the kind of child that if you tell him NOT to do something, he may do it out of rebellion!

He visited this relative over the holidays. When he returned he told me he wanted to be Episcopalian. I asked why and he said because he believed that you did not need to be a specific religion to go to Heaven. He said he remembered when he was younger, being asked to convert because they "wanted to see him in Heaven". He remembered.

Aaron finding his peace at 12 years old is a moving experience for me. He took all of his cultural values into consideration, truly studied and compared Episcopalianism, and made the choice himself. He found the Great Spirit. He found Christ. Thanks be to God.

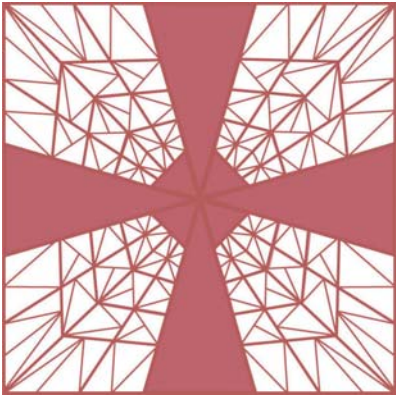

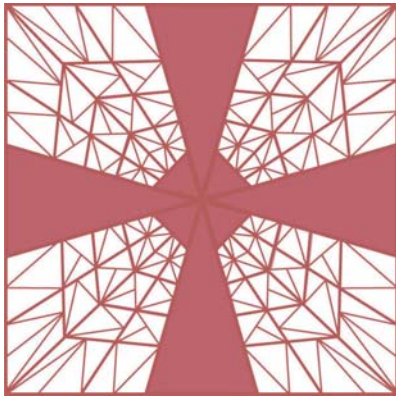
