

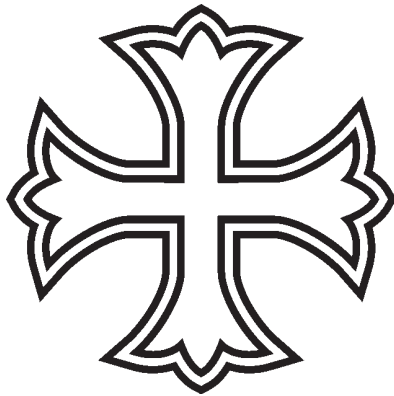

Report on the 37th Annual Convention

Holy Cross delegates Jane Briscione, Greer Mims, Scott Wilson, and Mike Varner attended the 37th Annual Diocesan Convention on February 21-23 in Mobile, Alabama. The theme for the convention was, "Rejoicing in the Spirit".

Bishop Philip Duncan opened the convention and in his convention address he welcomed three churches to parish status - St. Mary's of Andalusia, St. Paul's Chapel of Magnolia Springs and St Augustin of Canterbury in Navarre. The bishop then summed up the status of the diocese:

- Plans are being made to make the Dominican Republic our companion diocese.
- Beckwith is involved in further growth and development. The Coastal Wonders program had 600 students and the summer camps served 750 youth, grades 2-12. The conference center has been used by DOK, Cursillo, Girl Scouts and Elderhostel, to name a few. The ropes course was active this year. Improvements to the dining hall are planned. There is a Beckwith celebration planned for April 6th.
- The Murray House residents have participated in trips and it currently has 95% - 100% occupancy.

- Wilmer Hall is growing. The board of trustees for Wilmer Hall voted to separate from state mandates and will now rely on other funding.
- Bishop Duncan thanked the diocesan staff.
- Two blue ribbon committees were established. One committee is for Human sexuality, to address ethics issues for the Lambeth conference. The other committee is supposed to look at the structure of the diocese, missions, vision, staffing and funding.
- Communication was an issue that the bishop wanted to address. The "Coastline" was commended for its work and the position of editor as a full time position will be called to be in the budget as a line item. There has been a reduction in the diocesan staff.
- The coordinator of youth ministries position was eliminated and Avery Hall and Rob Dixon have stepped in the fill the role. It is too large a task for volunteers and the diocese will seek funding for a full time position.
- Bishop Duncan recognized missions and commissions -five deacons were called to be priests and one seminarian to deacon. The bishop recognized our parish

Search Committee Report #6

When I reported to you last month, there were eight priests who were still in the process of discernment with our search committee. Now there are three.

The first weekend of this month we met with the first of the three priests under consideration. Each member of the search committee had an opportunity to spend a little one-on-one time with both the priest and his wife. We enjoyed meals together at various times during the week, and a social gathering with dinner on Friday evening. On Saturday morning we enjoyed a worship service, including Sermon and Eucharist, led by our invited priest. Following

that we spent two hours asking questions and getting to each other as well as we could.

We'll follow a similar pattern with the next two priests who are scheduled to visit over the next few weeks. The last visit will occur in mid-April.

We are greatly encouraged. I honestly believe that one of these priests will be recommended to become our next rector.

Diocesan Convention Continued...

administrator, Sarah Eagle Heart, in her selection to the United Nations Commission on the Status of Woman. All other reports were filed by title.

The bishop thanked Bishops Bob Jones and Herbert Donovan for assisting with the diocesan convention. The house of Bishops will be meeting in Texas. Lambeth issues will be discussed along with the discipline of priests and bishops who choose to leave the church. At the meeting of bishops, no statements are binding. It is simply a time to share opinions of gathered bishops. The Lambeth conference is held every ten years and is called by the Bishop of Canterbury in England –Diocese of Liverpool—from July 16-August 4. This time the conference will include a four day retreat.

The budget has a \$50,000 deficit in reduced giving to the diocese. The diocese had to use \$77, 000 from unrestricted funds to balance the budget. The diocesan staff was reduced by 3. The bishop reminded the delegates that 97% of the total income of the diocese comes from the churches. We have approximately \$225,000 in unrestricted funds and cannot avoid withdrawing funds if the diocesan funds are reduced. Outreach has been reduced from 25% to 12%. The finance committee has had changes in personnel and office programs. Visiting bishops have been canceled for the months of Sept-Nov. Bishop Duncan believes that this will mean that he will have to use an 18 month rotation to diocesan churches instead of a 12 month rotation. The elimination of a reception secretary position has been filled by volunteers, but needs to be a full time position. Vince Currie plans to reduce his work to part time. Each delegate was called to go back to his or her respective church and encourage parishioners to increase giving to the diocese for corporate ministry.

Vince Currie received the distinguished service award as diocesan administrator. Bishop Charles Duval was on the phone during the recognition ceremony. New priests and interim priests were recognized. Dates and locations for the next diocesan convention were announced. The 38th annual convention will be held Feb 5 – 7, 2009 at All Saints, Mobile. The 39th annual convention will be held Feb 4-6, 2010 and be sponsored by the Emerald Coast churches. Jackie McCracken presented pictures to the bishop of the Tuskegee choir from last year. Nominations were presented for officers and committees. All reports were accepted. Offerings from the convention will go to the Dioceses of Louisiana and Mississippi.

A resolution was submitted during the meeting from the finance committee, that we should accept a deficit budget of \$62,930. This is in lieu of increasing the line item expense for the coastline of \$8,000. The director of the coastline would be a contract position with no benefits. An additional \$20,000 line item for a Youth Coordinator –with a job description and professional search to begin would be added. If each church in the diocese were to donate 5% more of the already pledged amount then we would be able to accept a balanced budget. Resolution was voted on and

passed.

A second resolution presented by the commission on world missions read: *Resolved, that the 37th annual convention of the Diocese of the Central Gulf Coast endorses the formation of a companion relationship between this diocese and the Diocese of the Dominican Republic, beginning the 23rd day of February, 2008, until terminated by either diocese, Be it further resolved, that the bishop and commission on world missions be requested to set up a representative Companion relations committee to implement this relationship, including the recruitment of persons and congregations in the diocese to participate in this relationship, subject to the approval of the Standing committee of the diocese of the central gulf coast and the Executive Council of the Episcopal church.* The resolution passed.

Other announcements and reports:

- Dorothy Curry gave a presentation on the Murray House.
- We received a report from Sewanee- seminary college - School of theology.
- Steve Masters gave a report from Beckwith.
- The bishop made nominations to the standing committee.
- Elections for both standing committee clergy and layperson and General convention clergy and lay persons were conducted.
- Duane Leifur introduced Rev. Diane Livingston to talk about Camp Coast Care.
- Hugh Wheelless, chairman of the Christ Church Cathedral campaign, spoke about donations this year being accredited and placed on a founders list.
- Dave Quittmeyer challenged the churches to meet the budget by signing a board that listed the additional 5% of pledged amount. Delegates came up and signed the board as an outward expression of the commitment to achieve a balanced budget.
- Daughters of the King were recognized for prayers given throughout the convention.
- The Bishop was invited to the Happening closing, but declined as he will be in Texas. He invited all others to attend the closing.
- Trinity Church in Apalachicola invited the diocese to attend a tour of homes on May 3rd. Southern Living Magazine has featured Apalachicola in their magazine. Vicar Martha Harris, Trinity, extended the invitation.

With all business being completed the convention ended with a Eucharist. The delegates to the convention thank you for allowing them to represent Holy Cross at the 37th Annual Diocesan Convention.

52nd United Nations Commission on the Status of Women

Experiencing the 52nd United Nations (UN) Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) was an amazing learning process of non-governmental advocacy. The 125 Anglican Women, including myself as a first time Episcopal Church delegate, join other faith-based non governmental organizations to empower women to strengthen world wide communities through equality and justice for all women and men, of all faiths and walks of life.

The primary theme was “Financing for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women”. However, many issues were addressed including through the emerging theme: “Gender Perspectives on Climate Change”. As well as review themes: “Women’s Equal Participation in Conflict Prevention, Management and Conflict Resolution and in Post-conflict Peacebuilding”, and “Indicators on Violence against Women and Children”. These themes influence agreed conclusions containing priority recommendations for governments, intergovernmental bodies and other institutions, civil society actors and other stakeholders, to be implemented at the international, national, regional, and local level. Additionally, the Commission adopts resolutions on a range of issues during this time.

The Anglican Women join the Ecumenical Women which brings women of faith from around the world to tell their stories and address government delegates. The Ecumenical Women advocate for governments to fully implement the Beijing Platform for Action, agreed upon at the 1995 Fourth World Conference on Women, held in China in 1995. The Beijing Platform for Actions addresses Millennium Development Goal #3-Promoting Gender Equality and Empowering Women. The Ecumenical Women coalition trains religious women on UN procedures and effective advocacy techniques. As well as providing time for fellowship, prayer, and discussion during the

Commission. Services were held daily at the United Nations Church Center.

Highlights of the opening plenary was the launch of United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon multi-year campaign to intensify action to end violence against women and girls. “Violence against women and girls makes its hideous imprint on every continent, country and culture,” said the Secretary-General. “It is time to focus on the concrete actions that all of us can and must take to prevent and eliminate this scourge -- Member States, the United Nations family, civil society and individuals -- women and men. It is time to break through the walls of silence, and make legal norms a reality in women’s lives.” Another inspiring speaker was Kevin Powell, MTV’s Real World Star turned activist and author of *The Confessions of a Recovering Misogynist*, discussed the Role and Responsibility of Men to Prevent Violence against Women.

The CSW Bureau plays a crucial role in preparing and ensuring the successful outcome of annual sessions of the Commission. For more information on the current membership of the commission by country and Bureau officers please visit www.un.org/womenwatch/daw/csw/index.html.

CSW’s Future Program of Work — Annual Priority Themes and Review Themes — is based around the outcome of the ten-year review of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, the 2005 World Summit and the work of the Commission on the Status of Women since 1996. 2009 Priority Theme and 2011 Review Theme: “Sharing of responsibilities for home and family, including care-giving in the context of HIV/AIDS.”

I have given just a very broad overview of the 10 day CSW event and will present a future article to *Coastline*, as well make presentations to Diocesan groups. I thank Holy Cross and our volunteers for allowing me this opportunity.

We all want to make Holy Cross a place of caring and hope for all our people. This is truly a wonderful place where people feel welcome and cared for and that is what Pastoral Care is all about.

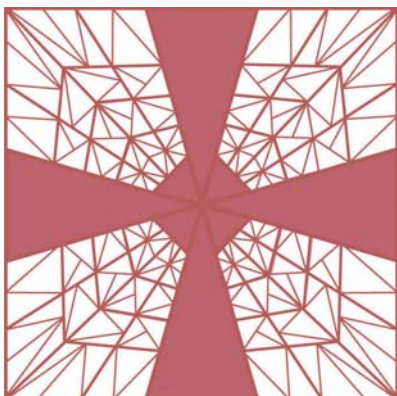

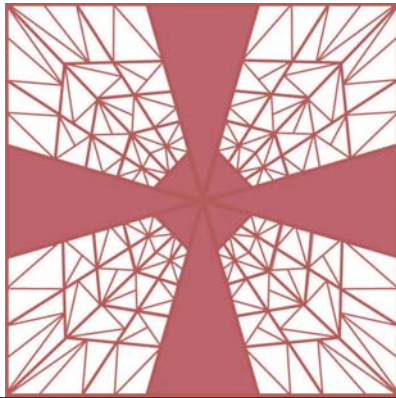
