The Collect of the Day - prayed by the Celebrant

The First Reading: *Acts 13:1-5*

Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen (who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch) and Saul.² While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, “Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.”³ So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed

their hands on them and sent them off.⁴ The two of them, sent on their way by the Holy Spirit, went down to Seleucia and sailed from there to Cyprus.⁵ When they arrived at Salamis, they proclaimed the word of God in the Jewish synagogues. John was with them as their helper.

Reader The Word of the Lord.
People *Thanks be to God.*

Psalm: 15 (read responsively by half verse)

- 1 Lord, who may dwell in your tabernacle?
who may abide upon your holy hill?
- 2 Whoever leads a blameless life and does what is right,
who speaks the truth from his heart.
- 3 There is no guile upon his tongue;
he does no evil to his friend;
he does not heap contempt upon his neighbor.
- 4 In his sight the wicked is rejected,
but he honors those who fear the Lord.
- 5 He has sworn to do no wrong
and does not take back his word.
- 6 He does not give his money in hope of gain,
nor does he take a bribe against the innocent.
- 7 Whoever does these things
shall never be overthrown.

“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. “Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. “Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. “Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. “Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. “Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. “Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. “Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness’ sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. “Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account.
