## The Service of the Word

**The Collect of the Day** - *prayed by the Celebrant*

**The First Reading:** Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord  
sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his  
robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance  
above him; each had six wings: with two they  
covered their faces, and with two they covered their  
feet, and with two they flew. And one called to  
another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts;  
the whole earth is full of his glory."

The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of  
those who called, and the house filled with  
smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for

I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a  
people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen  
the King, the LORD of hosts!"

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal  
that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs.  
The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that  
this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and  
your sin is blotted out." Then I heard the voice of the  
Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for  
us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!"

*Reader* The Word of the Lord.  
*People* ***Thanks be to God.***

**Psalm: 138** (read responsively by whole verse)

- 1 I will give thanks to you, O LORD, with my  
whole heart; before the gods I will sing your  
praise.
- 2 **I will bow down toward your holy temple  
and praise your Name, because of your  
love and faithfulness;**
- 3 For you have glorified your Name and your word  
above all things.
- 4 **When I called, you answered me; you  
increased my strength within me.**
- 5 All the kings of the earth will praise you,  
O LORD, when they have heard the words of  
your mouth.
- 6 **They will sing of the ways of the LORD, that  
great is the glory of the LORD.**
- 7 Though the LORD be high, he cares for the lowly;  
he perceives the haughty from afar.
- 8 **Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you  
keep me safe; you stretch forth your hand  
against the fury of my enemies; your right  
hand shall save me.**
- 9 The LORD will make good his purpose for me;  
O LORD, your love endures forever; do not  
abandon the works of your hands.

### The Gospel Reading: Luke 5:1-11

*Reader* The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

*People* **Glory to you Lord Christ.**

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

### The Nicene Creed (p. 358 BCP)

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.  
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father,  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God,  
begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.  
Through him all things were made.  
For us and for our salvation  
he came down from heaven:  
by the power of the Holy Spirit  
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,

and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;  
he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again  
in accordance with the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped &  
glorified.

He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic\* and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come. *Amen.*

(\*“catholic” means universal)

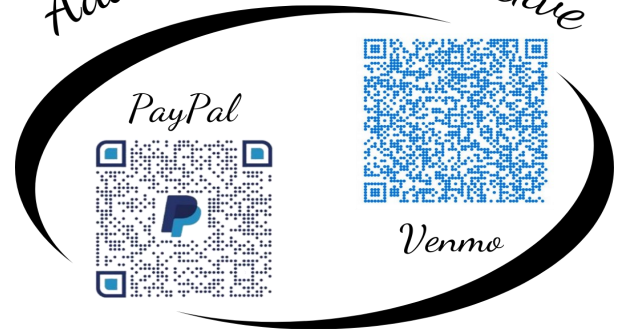
