### The Service of the Word

#### Opening Hymn 150: "Forty Days and Forty Nights"

*Celebrant* Bless the Lord who forgives all our sins.  
*People* ***His mercy endures forever.***

#### The Confession *Altogether*

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. *Amen.*

#### CHILDREN'S CHAPEL \*\*\* (Ages 4 – 10 years)

#### The Collect of the Day - prayed by the Celebrant

#### The First Reading: *Romans 8:6-11*

The mind governed by the flesh is death, but the mind governed by the Spirit is life and peace. <sup>7</sup> The mind governed by the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law, nor can it do so. Those who are in the realm of the flesh cannot please God.

You, however, are not in the realm of the flesh but are in the realm of the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God lives in you. And if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, they do not belong to Christ. <sup>10</sup> But if Christ is in you, then even though your body is subject to death because of sin, the Spirit gives life because of righteousness. And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he

who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of his Spirit who lives in you.

*Reader* The Word of the Lord.  
*People* ***Thanks be to God.***

#### Psalm: 130 (read responsively by whole verse)

- 1 Out of the depths have I called to you, O LORD; LORD, hear my voice; let your ears consider well the voice of my supplication.
- 2 If you, LORD, were to note what is done amiss, O Lord, who could stand?
- 3 For there is forgiveness with you; therefore you shall be feared.
- 4 I wait for the LORD; my soul waits for him; in his word is my hope.
- 5 My soul waits for the LORD, more than watchmen for the morning, more than watchmen for the morning.
- 6 O Israel, wait for the LORD, for with the LORD there is mercy;
- 7 With him there is plenteous redemption, and he shall redeem Israel from all their sins.
