#### The Call of the Bells

It's not that I'm a fuddy-duddy, as every "fuddy-duddy" claims about themselves. However, Amanda and I made the choice not to tell our children that Santa was real for our own reasons, and we haven't regretted it. Yet,

if I had to do it over again, I would handle one thing differently. From the start, I would talk more to them about the real power behind the story of Saint Nicholas.

It's worth noting that there are no historical documents attesting to the existence of Saint Nicholas; therefore, nothing is known for certain about him. However, through the years, dating back to the fourth century, it has been passed down that there once existed a man named Nicholas whose life was so faithful and hopeful for the world that he should never be forgotten.

The time in which Nicholas would have lived was a period of great persecution for Christianity within the Roman Empire. The Catholic Church claims that Nicholas became a well-known and loved bishop, but let's not misunderstand. Bishops and Christian leaders were often tortured during this time, given the choice between renouncing the faith and death. Being a bishop wouldn't have meant a life of fancy clothes and parades of adoring followers in the streets. It would likely have meant being a target, somewhat of an outlaw, forced to live in the shadows and navigate life in secret. This means that Nicholas would have been a remarkable person with a remarkable faith, unyielding to any truth but the truth of God in Christ.

But what made his life's story transcend time? It was his generosity. Yet, if we look at the facts, the most reliable tale about his life seems to be the simple story of his generosity to a poor man and his three daughters. Nicholas provided the dowry for the three girls to save them from a life of disrepute. But, yesterday, I saw a Sandy Sansing commercial (you know, the car dealer) talking about how much he does for the poor every Christmas, and he does like a thousand times that of St. Nicholas every year! What gives?

The answer to me seems clear. Although some claim he was a rich man, I think the story suggests otherwise. Living in a time when his own life was difficult and his future was insecure, living depending upon the grace of God to see him



through another day, and living as a person whose role and responsibility as a bishop seemed important and worthy of prioritizing above that of others, Nicholas took from his own pocket that which could have benefited him and gave it to another's need. The story of Nicholas is not the story of a rich man (no offense Sandy Sansing) giving out of his abundance that which

he really did not need. It is the story of a desperate man whose faith enabled him to hope more in God, to trust more in God than in the power of gold for his future.

Put simply, what has made his life's story transcend time is the fact that Saint Nicholas' life is a testimony of one who hoped in the right things – for him, it was God above gold. He reminds me that so much of my life, joy, and fulfillment today depends on where I put my hope. In the simple story of his giving of his own well-being to help another, I am reminded how, if I hope in my wealth to provide for me in this life, if I hope in success or renown in this life, if I hope in popularity or anything in this life above the love of God and neighbor, then my hope will fade like the setting sun, and I will be left in the dark and cold.

But if I can, like Nicholas, not think myself more important than I am, and if I can, in the moment of decision, remember where my true hope resides and act out of hope in God and compassion for my neighbor, then my life's story too can be one that transcends the time of my own existence. I can have ripple effects in the lives of all whom I come into contact with. Maybe we will not have songs with reindeer written about us, and hopefully, people will not leave out cookies for us everywhere we go. But seeking such a life is indeed our calling and, therefore, the key to living a happy Christmas and a great year all the years of our lives.

This year, when I hear the sound of bells associated with Christmas, I imagine that maybe, after Nicholas had given away his coins to save those girls, he learned to be happy with the sound of bells over the sound of coins in his pockets. Now, the sound of Christmas bells serves as a reminder to take notice of what and in whom I am placing my hope.


